<p>Reading Test 46 Questions 75 minutes Math Test 46 Questions 75 minutes Writing Test 44 Questions 38 minutes Writing Test 1 Essay 30 minutes</p> <p>Total Test Time 4.5 to 5 hours with breaks</p> <p>Other Factors to Consider:</p> <p>Good for those who are familiar and comfortable with keyboard entry and are computer savvy.</p> <p>Get your scores immediately for the reading and math test.</p> <p>Receive the writing scores within 3-4 weeks.</p> <p>Offered six days a week at Prometric Testing Center in Glastonbury: 860-633-7236.</p> <p>Must transfer information from a computer screen to scrap paper (i.e. for math problem solving), which increases the opportunity for error due to the transposition of information.</p> <p>Effective for those who are visual and language-oriented types of learners.</p>	<p>Reading Test 40 Questions 60 minutes Math Test 40 Questions 60 minutes Writing Test 38 Questions 30 minutes Writing Test 1 Essay 30 minutes</p> <p>Total Test Time 3.5 to 4 hours with breaks</p> <p>Other Factors to Consider:</p> <p>Good for those who like to write notes while reading and make associations with the information directly in front of them on a piece of paper.</p> <p>May benefit one who is slow with keyboard entry and not comfortable using a computer.</p> <p>Get your scores for all three tests within 3-4 weeks.</p> <p>Offered approximately 6-8 times per year.</p> <p>More availability of testing locations; offered at many colleges and universities all over the state.</p> <p>Allows one to write directly on the test booklet to solve a problem or record notes while reading, which reduces the risk of error.</p> <p>Effective for those who are very concrete, sequential, and kinesthetic.</p>
